Al-Anon meets in the Jesus' Friends Classroom each Monday at noon.

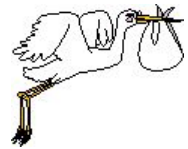

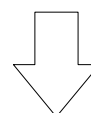



Animal Shelter Needs
