

## **SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON** Jonah 3:1-5, 10; 4:1-3

<sup>1</sup> The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." <sup>3</sup> So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD.
